1. United Provinces of India: Directed by Chris Hemming of Passion Pictures.

This video features **Gordon Warnecke** who you may remember as co-lead in the cult classic film, '**My Beautiful Launderette**' and was shot in & around **Hoxton Market**. The end result is a multi-layer of influences supported with endless energy, colour and synchronicity. Much like the single and album itself.

2. Topknot: Directed by Prashant Barghava, footage taken from his film set in India, Patang.

Featuring footage from the upcoming feature film **The Kite** (**Patang**) written and directed by **Prashant Bhargava**. In the old city of **Ahmedabad**, amid **India's** largest kite festival, a family duels, spins and soars like the countless kites in the skies above.

**3. Who Fingered Rock 'n' Roll:** Directed/Edited by **Esteban Gitton**. Archive footage filmed on **16mm** film camera from the Boroughs of **Hackney & Sutton &** the **City of London** 

As **London** changed and rebuilt after **2**<sup>nd</sup> **World War**, so did the music scene. Both have continued to change but has time has gone on, the builders of big buildings have had more of a say in the music industry. Who built the city? Who fingered rock 'n' roll?

## 4. Free Love: Directed by Chris Hemming of Passion Pictures.

**Hemming**: "The brief from the band was for me to include love, religion and to give the film an intergalactic feeling. The resulting video is an existential cosmic tale following the small and large cogs of life. The animation of the silver city is stop frame animation, as are all the effects. The rabbits were animated in 2D (pencil and then inked). The background plate is live action footage I shot of a **200 LED** 'Star Cloth'. It was then lovingly composited in **After Effects**. "

### **5. Soul School:** Directed and animation by **Abi Williams** from **Rude**.

**Abi** and **Tjinder** met through their children's nursery in **Stoke Newington**. They formed a friendship quickly and collaborated on this vibrant and very **Cornershop** animation. **Abi** created the video for the single, **Soul School**, featuring her friend **Sarah's** holiday snaps (leaping from **Mexico** to **Africa** and an **Australian** kangaroo popping its head up from time to time).

# 6. The Roll Off Characteristics (Of History in the Making): Directed by Prashant Barghava.

It features this time, total outtakes of the upcoming feature film **The Kite** (**Patang**) and is centered around an Indian wedding band and at times of the wedding itself.

## 7. Operation Push: Directed & Edited by David Kaplowitz.

**Singh** says, "The song itself envisages the planet earth creating one last sing along in the form of an orchestra made up of different countries getting eradicated in their own way, and whereas **Jamaica** was the hi-hat, the string section is contributed by what used to be **West Moreland**. I like the video because it is not too literal, has humour but still pushes the politics out."



## 8. Supercomputed: Directed by Justin Rhodes, Doko Films.

Documentary filmmaker, **Justin Rhodes** cleverly completes this portrait of modern **Britain** committing 'Supercomputed' to film, shot on location in the now infamous Ali's Barbers of Bethnal Green Road.

Rhodes: "I listened to 'Supercomputed' as I walked the streets of my neighbourhood of East London, I didn't know what Bubbley was singing but the strong rhythms of the track, I felt, demanded something with a driving edit, i.e. one that has sharp cuts! I presented a couple of ideas to Cornershop but the one they really responded to was the idea of filming at Ali's Barbers. I have to say a thank you to Richard Nicholson whose photographs of customers at Ali's really inspired the piece. What I, and I think Cornershop, saw in the pictures and what I hope people will see is a portrait of young, largely Asian men, celebrated; these are not hooded teenagers to be suspicious of, we see them up close, clear and sharp."

9. Something Makes You Feel Like: Directed by Pete Gomes. London through a beautiful pensive head

Fusing **Super 8mm** film and **HD video**, the carefully devised, sequenced and unedited silent performance by **Nile Bailey** forms the basis of the video. His expressions evoke subtle links between memory and various **London** locations.

**11. WORLD PREMIERE: Non-Stop Radio:** Directed and animated by **Bangalore**'s **Rocket Science** this one off track was produced by **Tjinder Singh** and soon to be released as part of 'The Singhles Club'

**Sharma & Thomas: "Non-Stop Radio** is a new dimension to our work. The idea was in designing a character that can imprint itself indelibly in our consciousness. A human narration of an emotional trip created out of real world and the boundless visual journeys of the mind shot for each beat, while reflecting the style and viewpoint of its creator. The radio character shot in stop motion juxtaposed against paper sets shot in top angle."
